- **INTERFAITH CHAPLAINCY** brings people together to worship, reflect and learn. Our chaplain is also on-site for spiritual care at Sturdy Memorial Hospital.
- **RESOURCE JUNCTION** provides assistance to individuals and families thru community collaborations – Society of St. Vincent de Paul (utility), South Coastal Counties Legal Services (legal), Attleboro YMCA (showers), and others (blankets, hygiene kits, insect repellant, clothing, etc.)
- HOMES WITH HEART is a collaborative program with Community Counseling of Bristol County that assists with homeless outreach and permanent supportive housing.
